RESOLUTION TO AMEND 2021 PHA PLAN ANNUAL SUBMISSION

WHEREAS, the Scott County Community Development Agency (CDA) owns 40 units of public housing, Development Number MN184000001, located at Prior Manor, 16049 Franklin Trail SE, Prior Lake, MN 55372 (the Development); and

WHEREAS, the Development is inefficient to operate as public housing and could be operated more efficiently and better funded if supported by tenant-based and project-based vouchers rather than public housing; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has implemented an initiative under which properties such as the Development may have their subsidy converted from public housing to tenant-based vouchers under Notice PIH 2019-05, "Streamlined Voluntary Conversions of Last Remaining Projects of Small Public Housing Agencies" (Streamlined Voluntary Conversion); and

WHEREAS, the CDA proposes to use Streamlined Voluntary Conversion to convert the Development from public housing to tenant-based vouchers and to exit the public housing program in this manner; and

WHEREAS, as part of the Streamlined Voluntary Conversion requirements, to retain ownership the CDA also must fulfill the application requirements for property retention under Notice 2016-20, Disposition Instructions for the Public Housing Agency (PHA) Retention of Certain Public Housing Real Property (that is no longer used or was never used for public housing dwelling purposes) free from Public Housing Use Restrictions (Property Retention); and

WHEREAS, HUD approval of Streamlined Voluntary Conversion and Property Retention is expected to result in the CDA's continued ownership of the Development with a requirement that the Development be used for at least 30 years as affordable housing for households with incomes at initial occupancy that do not exceed 80% of the Annual Median Income; and

WHEREAS, HUD will provide tenant-based vouchers to replace the public housing subsidies, which residents may use to stay at the Development or to move; and

WHEREAS, the CDA expects to use available tenant protection or other vouchers to attach project-based vouchers to units at the Development from which residents have

vacated, or where residents have agreed to accept project-based vouchers rather than retain tenant-based vouchers; and

WHEREAS, HUD requires reference to the Streamlined Voluntary Conversion application and to authorization of the Property Retention action in the PHA Annual Plan; and

WHEREAS, such reference is not a substantial deviation or significant amendment to/modification from the PHA Annual Plan submission and thus can be approved by the Board of Commissioners without an additional public hearing and comment process;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED THAT:

The Executive Director is authorized to submit to HUD an amendment to the CDA's PHA Annual Plan submission that references the Streamlined Voluntary Conversion application and authorization of the Property Retention action, in the form of Attachment A to this resolution.

Attachment A: Amendment to 2021 Scott County Community Development Agency PHA Annual Plan Submission

The 2021 Scott County Community Development Agency PHA Annual Plan submission, approved by the Board of Commissioners on October 13, 2020 and submitted to HUD thereafter, is amended by inserting a new page immediately after Form 50075-SM that shall read as follows:

C.1.A. (b). Description of new Activity

During 2021, the PHA expects to submit a Streamlined Voluntary Application under Notice PIH 2019-05, including a property retention authorization request that meets the requirements of Notice PIH 2016-20, with respect to its last 40 units of public housing. If HUD approves, the PHA would receive replacement tenant protection vouchers that would allow current residents to remain at the property or to move.

To the extent residents move from the property or where residents have agreed to accept project-based vouchers rather than retain tenant-based vouchers, the CDA would expect to use available tenant protection or other vouchers to attach project-based vouchers to the vacated units.
