

Scott County CDA Waiting List Opening

Mainstream Voucher Program Waiting List

Serving people with disabilities who are age 18 through 61

The Mainstream Voucher program helps people pay for privately owned rental housing. Participants typically pay 30% of the rent with the voucher covering the difference. Applicants must meet preference and eligibility criteria to be placed on the waiting list. Aside from serving a special population, Mainstream vouchers are administered using the same rules as other housing choice vouchers.

1. When is the Mainstream Voucher Waiting list open?

- Scott County CDA will accept online applications from Tuesday, July 8, 2025 at 8:00 AM and will close on Tuesday, July 22, 2025 at 4:00pm.

2. How do I apply?

- Applications will be accepted online only at: <https://portal.scottcda.org/> (click on "Applicant login" on the top right).
- Applicants may use any computer, tablet, or smartphone with internet access to apply, including free computers at public libraries.
- Applications will not be available at the Scott County CDA offices.
- Fax or e-mail requests will not be accepted.
- To request a Reasonable Accommodation due to a disability related to this application, please contact the CDA Office at 952-402-9022.

3. Can I apply more than once?

- No, applicants cannot be on the same waiting list twice.

4. Can I edit my application after I submit it?

- Yes, you can edit your application by logging into your online portal at <https://portal.scottcda.org/>.

5. What information do I need to apply?

- A valid email address
- Names, Social Security numbers, and birth dates for all household members
- The household's gross annual income

6. What are the eligibility requirements for applying?

- At least one member of the household must be disabled and between the ages of 18-61 to meet the program eligibility criteria.
- At least one household member must be a U.S. citizen, U.S. national, or non-citizen with eligible immigration status.
- The applicant and all members of the applicant's household must disclose the complete and accurate social security number assigned to each household member.
- You must income qualify per household size. You cannot make more money than the income limits in the chart below:

Your household size must qualify for the appropriate unit size. We assign the first bedroom to the head of household and a spouse/partner, if applicable, and then each additional bedroom – to the next two persons regardless of sex, age, or relationship.

**The following circumstances are exceptions: Live-in aides will be allocated a separate bedroom, Foster adults and foster children will be allocated separate bedrooms.*
