

## Prairie Pointe 2-Bedroom, Project-Based Waiting-List Opening

*You must meet the Persons with Disability Preference Criteria to apply*

Prairie Pointe is an apartment complex located in Shakopee with project based rental assistance available for 2-bedroom units for those who qualify. Scott County CDA is administering a State-funded program called, *Bring it Home*, that offers Prairie Pointe residents residing in some of their 2 bedroom units, project based rental assistance. The rental assistance is attached to the unit, meaning households cannot move to another property with this type of rental assistance. People will typically pay 30% of their income for rent with the project based rental assistance covering the difference each month.

**Applicants must be a person with a disability (any person in the household) as defined by Minnesota Housing and meet all other eligibility criteria to be placed on the waiting list. See detailed criteria in this flyer.**

**1. When is the waiting list open?** Scott County CDA will accept online applications from:

Monday, February 23, 2026 8:00am to Wednesday, February 25, 2026 4:00pm

**2. How do I apply?**

- Applications will be accepted online only at: <https://portal.scottcda.org/> (click on "Applicant login" on the top right)
- Applicants may use any computer, tablet, or smartphone with internet access to apply, including free computers at public libraries.
- Applications will not be available at the Scott County CDA offices
- Fax or e-mail requests will not be accepted.

**3. Can I edit my application after I submit it?**

- Yes, you can edit your application by logging into your online portal at <https://portal.scottcda.org/> (click on "Applicant login")

**4. What information do I need to apply?**

- A valid email address
- Names and birth dates for all household members
- The household's gross annual income

**5. What are the eligibility requirements for applying?**

- a. Must be a person with a disability (any person in the household) experiencing one of the following:



- A serious, persistent mental illness
- A developmental disability
- Assessed as drug dependent and are receiving or will receive care and treatment services provided by an approved treatment programs
- A brain injury
- A permanent physical disability that substantially limits one or more of major life activities (not limited to mobility impairment).

- b. You must be a Minnesota resident at time of this application
- c. You cannot receive any other housing subsidy
- d. Your household size must qualify for the appropriate unit size. *See below subsidy standards for Prairie Pointe’s two-bedroom units:*

	Minimum # of persons	Maximum # of persons
2-bedroom unit	2	4
We assign the first bedroom to the head of household and a spouse/partner, if applicable, and then each additional bedroom – to the next two persons regardless of sex, age, or relationship. <i>Exceptions for Live-in aides, foster adults and foster children apply.</i>		

- 6. **How will households be placed on the waiting list?**
  - Eligible households will be placed on the waiting list by date and time with preference points given to households with children ages 18 and under.
- 7. **What are the Income Limits for these units?**  
 Households making 30% of the AMI or below is prioritized by this program and a requirement of Prairie Pointe.
  - 1 person household: \$27,800
  - 2 person household: \$31,800
  - 3 person household: \$35,750
  - 4 person household: \$39,700
  - 5 person household: \$42,900
